6.3.4 Research and Development

- A Special care is taken to encourage and motivate the students and the faculty so that they can involve themselves in research activities. For this the college provides the latest equipments along with internet facility in computer lab, Home science lab, communication Lab, The Library facility.
- The students and teachers have easy access to college infrastructure and other facilities.

- Educational, Industrial trips and University tours are organized.
- The visit to the historical places helps the student to learn about our composite culture and rich heritage.

- The organizations of seminars, lectures, by different departments in college help the students and faculty to meet and interact with the distinguished resource persons of the related area.
- Many faculty members have already published their research papers (international and national), articles in journals, magazines and books
- Many have attended seminars as delegates, research scholars' paper presenters and chairpersons in international/national and seminars conferences.
- College published their own college level magazine “ Chiriyā Da Chamba”

6.3.5 Library, ICT and Physical infrastructure

ICT

The institute facilitates the extensive use of ICT resources for teaching and learning. To clear the complex concepts, teachers deliver their lectures on projectors. Smart boards are used to strengthen the ICT facility for teaching and learning. Teachers from different departments are made familiar with such techniques from time to time; for this purpose the department of Computer Science organizes short term programmes for the faculty Members. The College has adopted a student centric approach in teaching and learning. In this approach various ICT facilities are provided to the teachers. Laptops and printers are provided to every department. Wi-Fi Internet facility is also provided so that teachers and students can access the internet time to time to search the topics related to their subject concerned.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- The college makes it certain that human resources are encouraged and their potential is properly utilized in the overall growth of the institution
- The Management follows strictly the laid down criteria of selection and ensures that meritorious staff is selected.
- The institution takes care of its human resources by regularly encouraging them to go in for faculty development programmes.
- Under the IQAC, Development programs for Faculty members are systematically planned and conducted.
- Faculty members are motivated to acquire additional qualifications
- Faculty members are encouraged by the Head of the Institution to present and publish papers in International and National Seminars and Conferences.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

The college follows the UGC/DPI/GNDU norms for recruitment of the teachers. First the advertisements on various vacancies are made in the different newspapers to invite the applications as per the affiliated University, Punjab Government and DPI norms. All the applicants are scrutinized and short listed as per the eligibility criteria. Eligible candidates are called for interview. The interview panel is made according to the UGC norms that include:-

1. Two subject experts deputed by the University and invited by the college.
2. One subject expert from University.
3. One nominee of VC.
4. President of the Managing Committee or Nominee from the Management.
5. Principal of the College
6. Head of the Concerned Department from the College.

Different candidates appear before the panel and are interviewed and selected by the panel on the basis of their academic score and performance in the interview. The list of the selected candidates is displayed and the call letter is sent to them so that they can join within the allotted time.

Ad-hoc Appointments:

In Response to open advertisement in newspapers, applications are invited for the concerned posts. Individual application is also accepted and the candidates are selected through personal interview taken by the Management, Principal and Head of the Departments. For selecting the candidates, rules of the Govt. / Univ. norms are considered. College has the required number of qualified and competent teachers to handle all the courses.

- Extension lectures and seminars by the researchers from the other colleges and Universities are organized in the college for the benefits of the students and faculty.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

The College has a well thought of plan for publicity which is executed by the admission and advertisement committee. The admission notification is published in the college prospectus which contains the detailed information about the number and range of traditional and professional courses, eligibility, process of admission and facility available. This is also advertised in the local newspapers and electronic media. Pamphlets and brochures are also distributed and sent door to door through bus campaigns in rural and urban areas, phone calls and letters are sent to students during each session. In addition to this various school are also visited to make them aware about the college courses and facilities and data of students are collected accordingly.

The admission process of the college is absolutely transparent. In the course where the admission seekers are more than the number of seats, principle of transparency is maintained. For this, weightage is given to the marks obtained by the students in the previous examination and a merit list is prepared to admit the students.

6.9 What efforts are made by the University/ Autonomous College for Examination Reforms?

- Evaluation mechanism includes both written tests and other methods of evaluation through house examinations projects, seminars, articles and quiz etc.
- According to University Rule, the condition to qualify for the exams is 75% attendance. Still the college has introduced the mid semester exams for the betterment of students so that they can prepare well for their final exams. But there are some students who fail to appear in house examination either because of their involvement in various activities such as sports, youth festival or due to some family problems or due to medical reasons. There are also some weak students who appeared in house Examinations but fail, keeping in view the welfare of the above category of students we conduct special class tests for them.
- In order to fulfil the university condition, number of lectures attended by the students in an academic year is counted term wise. Then lecture shortage is calculated and students are informed from time to time about the status regarding the number of lectures attended so

that they can cover up their lecture shortage if any, by attending classes regularly in the future.

- Some other reforms / measures taken by the university to improve the efficiency are:
- To check the unfair means in the final examination the supervisory staff on duty has been swapped among various colleges.
- The computerized working operative in the university has been extended to the affiliated colleges from the last few years.
- OMR answer sheets have been introduced from the session 2012-13.
- 20% marks is required for eligibility to be cleared for house test exams.



Renowned environmentalist Sant Balbir Singh Seechewal quoted that one of the means of controlling pollution is by planting more and more trees to make out environment green and clean. Seechewal has been planting around one lakhs plants of 40 types at the village nursery to distribute free of cost. Not only the environment, Sant Seechewal has worked for society as well, trying to eradicate poverty, ignorance, superstition, atrocities against women. College students are honoured every year by NRI from village Sanghe Khalsa for their achievements and students participate in various competitions also held there.


7.6 Any other relevant information the institution wishes to add.
