2.5.2 Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)
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The college undertook best efforts to improve the performance of students by framing significant reforms in Continuous Internal Evaluation. For CIE the college follows criteria as Principal & staff meeting is conducted to evaluate students in all classes for all courses. Each department conducts continuous internal assessment in its own manner. Remedial measures are taken by conducting tutorial classes to clarify doubts and re-explaining the critical topics. Various improvement measures like Class tests, oral tests, surprise tests, written tests, discussion procedure, assignments, seminars, projects, practical, extempore by which students are regularly evaluated by their subject teachers. In addition, house tests are being conducted in every semester. Career Counseling Cell provides guidance to students regarding their professional career and for pursuing higher education. The feedback system is provided to the students for giving the feedback on all parameters of the institution. The institute communicates progress report of their ward to the parents. In addition, remedial classes are conducted for the slow learners, absentee and the students who participate in sports, NSS activities & placement interviews. Special Tests are held for the final year students who have appeared & failed in any one of the semester theory papers relating to completion of their degree. The students are informed of the reappearing/recounting/revaluation scheme available to them.

The academic calendar was prepared and implemented for conducting examination, activities seminars & workshops as well as industrial visits etc. The academic calendar is prepared at the beginning of every academic year. Examination dates were decided by the Guru Nanak Dev University Amritsar and intimated to the departments, which was incorporated in the academic calendar as and when provided. Evaluation facilitates the students to seek help and tutor to address area that may need more attention. Extra classes are organized for weak students. Passing and failing ratio is prepared. Potential of students is also identified and develop. Apart from it seminars, presentations, projects, practical, assignments etc. are also part of continuous evaluation. ParentTeacher Meetings are organised by the concerned departments to make the guardians aware of the results and attendance of the students at regular intervals.
❖ Research and Development: College encourages all the faculty members to carry out research work .In order to inculcate Research Culture, Research committee has been formed in order to assist the faculty members .From time to time faculty member participate as Resource persons ,delegates ,Speakers and get their Research Articles published in various books and Journals.
❖ Library, ICT and Physical Infrastructure / Instrumentation: Library consists of ample numbers of books, journals, magazines and news papers. There is a main as well as departmental library which helps the students. Libraries are also seeking ways to students, learning eBooks, e-magazines, provide the student for extensive knowledge; proper clean environment is also provided in the library. Besides reading books available in the library students are asked and encouraged to explore vast knowledge available on the internet like Google, safari and they are given regular tasks to search for information, data, research papers available on the given topic and knowledge available on internet in addition to the text books. ❖ Industry Interaction / Collaboration : Companies are invited to conduct interviews, and hold talks and discussions; Career and counseling and Placement Cell of College provide students with exposure to resume writing, soft skill training and employment& placement opportunities; Dept of PGDFDGC and Home Science conducted Industry visit for the students for industrial knowledge and awareness.
