The different candidates appear before the panel and are interviewed and selected by the panel on the basis of their academic score and performance in the interview. The list of the selected candidates is displayed and the call letters are sent to them so that they can join within the allotted time.

Individual application is also accepted and the candidates are selected through personal interview taken by the Management, Principal and Head of the Departments. But there are some students who fail to appear in house examination either because of their involvement in various activities such as sports, youth festival or due to some family problems or due to medical reasons during the examination days. There are also some weak students who appeared in house Examinations but fail, keeping in view the welfare of the above category of students we conduct special class tests for them.
